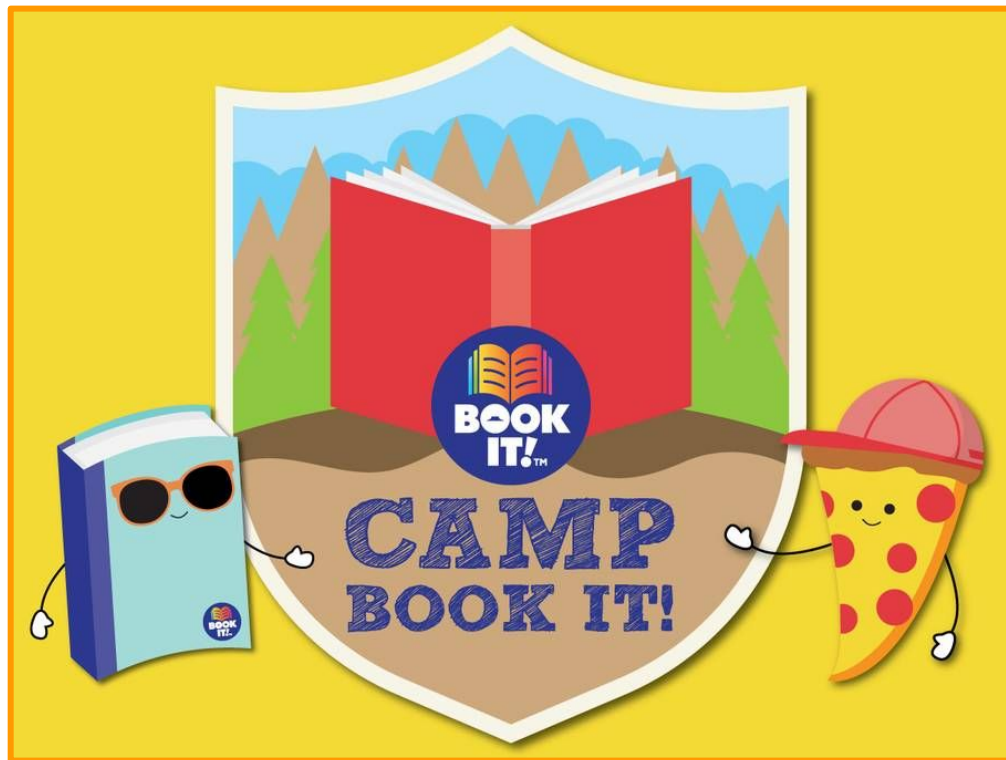

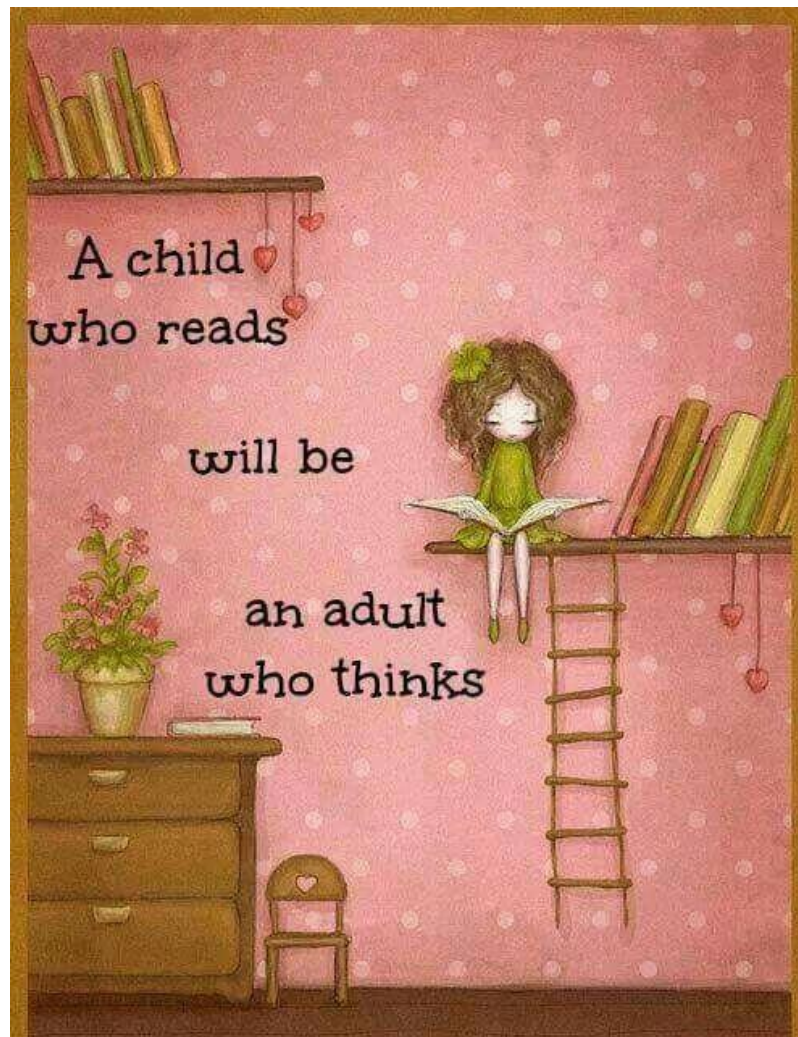
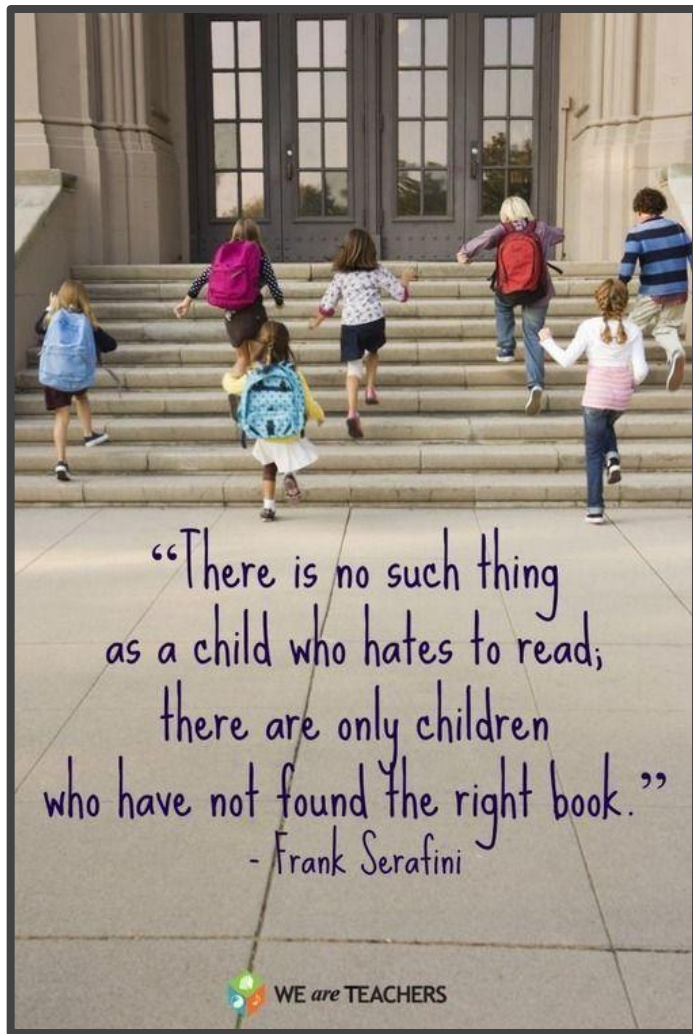
How can you help your  
child become a lifelong  
reader?

1. **Choice** - Let kids pick their own books. Even if it's a choice within certain guidelines, it's still a choice. No one likes to be forced to do anything, so the more autonomy kids can have, the better.
2. **Accountability** - Require a certain amount of time reading but we know that it won't happen with most of your tweens. Have your kids track minutes reading to earn minutes of screen time. However you plan it, make sure you're checking in on the reading so it doesn't get forgotten.
3. **Variety** - Think outside the traditional book here. Try ebooks, audiobooks, magazines, or blogs.
4. **Fun** - Get a new bean bag pillow just for reading. Read with headlamps in the dark. Read in the park, on the beach, or whatever your kids like, see if you can pair it with reading.
5. **Model** - Read with your kids, have them read aloud to your or you to them, or let them see you enjoying reading when you can.
